- Dramatic or Humorous





Audience Preparation Goal Interaction


- Communication with Audience
- Often fully prepared
- Inspire or inform
- No direct opposition

DEBATE

- Opposing team and judges
- Mixture of prepared and imprompturesponses
- Persuade with logic and evidence
- Direct engagement with opponent's arguments
